GLEBE VIEW STATUS REPORT Providence supports this initiative by Fairfax Presbyterian Church (FPC) to develop 12 affordable housing units as part of our Mathew 25 commitment. The town homes will be located in the parking lot adjacent to FPC. Fairfax City approved the zoning in November 2022. Since then efforts have been underway to obtain approval of a site plan and building permits from Fairfax City. After discussions and numerous submissions and resubmissions, we now believe (hope) that we will have the necessary approvals and permits by mid- to late-August. This will allow the project to begin sometime this October. The site work will be done over the Fall and Winter enabling construction on the actual town homes in the Spring of 2025. We are excited that it appears that construction will begin before the end of this year! Habitat for Humanity will be assisting with this project and there will be volunteer opportunities once the construction of the homes begins. Contact Fred Krebs for additional information.

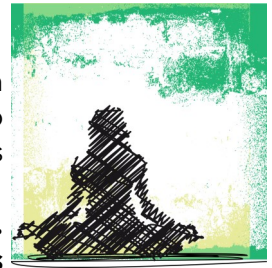

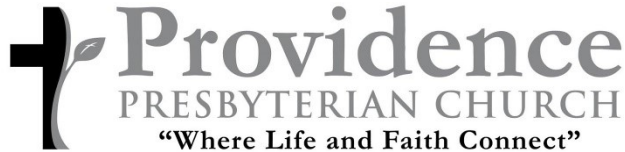
