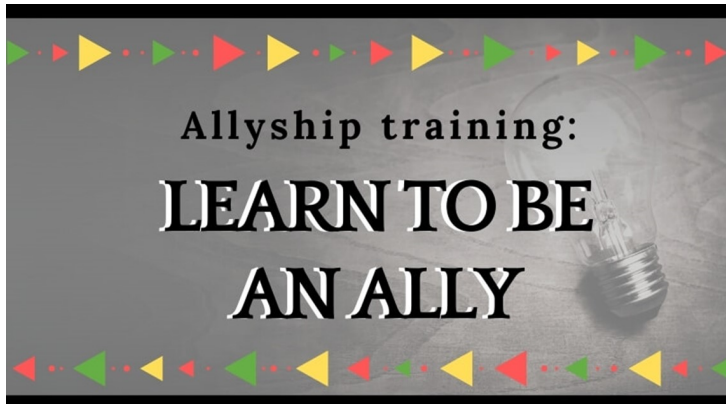


## **LEARN: Short Stories by Jesus**

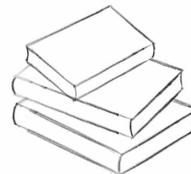

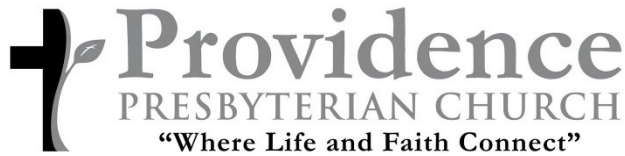
