2 On the third day there was a wedding in Cana of Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. **2** Jesus and his disciples had also been invited to the wedding. **3** When the wine gave out, the mother of Jesus said to him, "They have no wine." **4** And Jesus said to her, "Woman, what concern is that to me and to you?^[a] My hour has not yet come." **5** His mother said to the servants, "Do whatever he tells you." **6** Now standing there were six stone water jars for the Jewish rites of purification, each holding twenty or thirty gallons. **7** Jesus said to them, "Fill the jars with water." And they filled them up to the brim. **8** He said to them, "Now draw some out, and take it to the person in charge of the banquet." So they took it. **9** When the person in charge tasted the water that had become wine and did not know where it came from (though the servants who had drawn the water knew), that person called the bridegroom **10** and said to him, "Everyone serves the good wine first and then the inferior wine after the guests have become drunk. But you have kept the good wine until now." **11** Jesus did this, the first of his signs, in Cana of Galilee and revealed his glory, and his disciples believed in him.

Welcome, Trevor Tran, Director of Traditional Music Ministry

Trevor Tran is a conductor and educator based in the Washington, D.C., metropolitan area. Throughout his career in the DMV, he has led a diverse array of choral ensembles and served in leadership positions across several music organizations. Most recently, he served as Director of Music Ministry at Grace United Methodist Church in Gaithersburg, Maryland, and Artistic Director of the Northern Virginia Chorale in Springfield, Virginia. In addition to his work with community and church ensembles, Trevor has prepared choruses for performances with the National Symphony Orchestra and Baltimore Symphony Orchestra, collaborating with renowned conductors including Laurence Equilbey, Jonathon Heyward, Ton Koopman, Gianandrea Nosedà, and Masaaki Suzuki.

Prior to relocating to the Washington, D.C., region, Trevor served as Head of Performing Arts and Director of Vocal Arts at Fort Myers High School in Southwest Florida. Under his leadership, the school's choral ensembles earned top ratings at district and state music performance assessments and were selected for auditioned productions such as the Disney Candlelight Processional. In recognition of his work there, he was named a 2023

Yamaha “40 Under 40” Music Educator and a 2024 Temple University “30 Under 30” Artistic Visionary.

Besides being an educator, Trevor is a published composer where his works have been performed by ensembles and organizations including Resounding Achord, CORO, Choral Arts Initiative, and San José State University. Additionally, Trevor is an active clinician and presenter where he has led sessions at state, regional, and national conferences for organizations such as the American Choral Directors Association (ACDA) and the National Association for Music Education (NAfME). He currently serves on the Executive Board of the Maryland Chapter of the American Choral Directors Association.

Trevor holds a Bachelor of Music in Composition from San José State University, concurrent Master of Music degrees in Choral Conducting and Music Composition from Temple University, and a Doctor of Musical Arts in Choral Conducting from the University of Maryland, College Park.

Outside of work, Trevor enjoys spending time with his wife, Shannon, their three-year-old daughter, Maeve, their two-month-old son, Finnian, and their two dogs, Macie and Hilda.
